FINANCE COMMITTEE – Chair Arnason

On a motion by Mr. Powers, seconded by Mr. Whittington and carried by unanimous vote, the Board approved Charles Arnason, Richard Rash and Deanna Fehrer as signatures on a new Certificate of Deposit savings account.

PLANNING

On a motion by Mr. Powers, seconded by Mr. Whittington and carried by unanimous vote, the Board accepted the resignation of Erin Small, PE VCE agent who is transferring to the **VCE office in Goochland County.** Ms. Gunn is contacting her supervisors at VCE to get approval to serve as the appointed VCE agent for PSWCD board.

Ms. Fehrer reviewed the Annual Plan of Work accomplishments for September and upcoming workload for October. The draft schedule for the VASWCD Annual Meeting was passed around and Ms. Fehrer will complete the registration for those who want to attend. Early bird registration is due by October 13, 2023.

PERSONNEL COMMITTEE - Chair Dillard

Mr. Dillard reported the human resources consultant has completed the review of the District's personnel policy and job descriptions and Ms. Fehrer will be working on a draft of changes for the board to approve.

WATERSHED - Chair Arnason

Ms. Fehrer reported the trapping contractor has trapped 10 beavers at Bush #2 and will begin trapping at Bush #5 & #6 dams. The fall mowing will be delayed because of the rain this past weekend.

LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE - Chair Rash

Mr. Rash reported the following:

-District admin/ops funding was fully funded for only one year and that the budget template submissions for funding requests increased significantly.

-Surplus state funding was deposited into the WQIF and will provide an additional \$76M of VACS for FY24 with the remainder available in FY25.

-The VASWCD Board will meet tomorrow.

-The VA Clean Energy Act supports more solar energy installations and there are conversations that the General Assembly may act upon legislation that would limit locality authority in planning for solar land use.

-Nottoway County will be hiring a new county administrator. Philip Vannoorbeeck, the Blackstone Town Manager, is currently the acting administrator.

COMMUNICATION / EDUCATION - Chair Powers

On a motion by Mr. Rash, seconded by Mr. Powers and carried by unanimous vote, the Board approved \$150 for the sponsorship of a small ruminant program being organized by Amelia VCE to be held on November 30 at SPAREC.

On a motion by Mr. Powers, seconded by Mr. Rash and carried by unanimous vote, the Board approved \$500 for support of an outdoor classroom/garden at Amelia Academy. Amelia Academy has a new science teacher who submitted a letter of request after she learned about the previous outdoor classroom grants that PSWCD provided to local schools over the past couple of years.

Ms. Atkinson invited everyone to participate in "The Crunch Heard Around the Commonwealth" on October 5, by taking a bite out of a locally grown apple. The 'Project Wild' workshop that will be held on September 27 has 21 registered attendees and Ms. Atkinson is partnering with Amelia 4H agent, LK Mondrey, and Roger Pinholster to facilitate the workshop. The Ward Burton Foundation will be bringing their wildlife trailer to the workshop. Ms. Atkinson will be meeting with Amelia Elementary third grade teacher team about resources the District can provide and she will kick-off the Envirothon season soon.

DISTRICT MANAGER AND PARTNER AGENCY REPORTS

Staff reports (Attached)

Most items were covered under committee reports. Additionally, she reported the conservation staff completed 41 'end of lifespan' verifications. Mr. Smith is completing several final training sessions which includes: Grazing Plans; RUSLE2; Conservation Planning and Introduction to Conservation Engineering.

Department of Conservation and Recreation (Attached)

Ms. Collins reviewed several highlights on her report including upcoming deadlines and trainings. 1099 forms are now required to be filed electronically and DCR is working to modify the tracking program to accommodate the IRS requirement and will also provide training on the process.

Farm Service Agency (Attached)

Ms. Cook introduced Mr. Austin who has been hired as a Program Technician working in the Farmville office. There has been no official word on a possible federal government shutdown. The office has been finalizing end of year work.

USDA-NRCS – Farmville & Amelia (Attached)

Mr. Evans shared his report. His office has obligated all general CSP contracts. His office has been participating in several outreach events.

Prince Edward County

Mr. Stanley reported that the DEQ withdrawal permit for Sandy River Reservoir is being finalized. Trees on the slopes of the emergency spillway at Sandy River Reservoir have been removed. The County is beginning to work on their comprehensive plan and will be soliciting input from the District in regards to agriculture and environmental issues. There has been significant interest in solar installations on properties in the county. Plans for a meat processing facility have been finalized and they hope to break ground soon. Several potential commercial operations located near PE Agriculture building are moving through the approval process, and these include Wawa, a carwash and Harbor Freight.

Longwood University

Dr. Kathy Gee reported her students have completed the first round of rain water harvesting water testing and will complete the second round in December. The data will be shared after it is finalized.
