Mr. Wootton reported the VACS contract 05-24-0003, instance 537987, approved in July 2024, had the first well dug and it was dry. There is enough funding in the original approval to cover the costs of a dry well. On a motion by Mr. Arnason, seconded by Mr. Powers and carried by unanimous vote, the Board approved the inclusion of the dry well costs in the project.

FINANCE COMMITTEE – Chair Arnason

On a motion by Mr. Arnason, seconded by Mr. Adams and carried by unanimous vote, the Board authorized the Finance Committee to purchase a vehicle through either the state vehicle contracts or local car dealerships, whichever is most economical. Ms. Fehrer reported the vehicle will replace the 2007 Ford Explorer which has over 160,000 miles. Currently our insurance policy will only cover \$1,000 if there is a claim. The new vehicle will need to have 4WD and a factory installed towing package. Ms. Fehrer also reported that she and Mr. Arnason received information regarding the state's Risk Management Program and they are researching insurance policies to ensure that if the District enrolls in that program there will be adequate coverage.

PLANNING

On a motion by Mr. Arnason, seconded by Mr. Powers and carried by unanimous vote, the Board approved Ms. Gunn to serve as the appointed VCE agent for the PSWCD Board. Ms. Gunn will submit the paperwork that will be forwarded to DCR for formal approval at the State Soil & Water Conservation Board meeting in December.

Ms. Fehrer reviewed the Annual Plan of Work upcoming workload for November and December.

PERSONNEL COMMITTEE - Chair Dillard

Mr. Dillard reported Ms. Fehrer will send out draft changes to the Personnel Policy and Job Descriptions for board action in November.

WATERSHED - Chair Arnason

Mr. Arnason reported Bander Smith provided estimates for the gate repairs that they had previously inspected. The estimates ranged from \$40,000 - \$60,000 per dam. Ms. Fehrer has submitted a funding request to DCR for all four repairs. Bander Smith may be the sole source contractor for the repair. As funding gets approved, the staff will proceed with contract procurement.

LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE - Chair Rash

Mr. Rash reported the draft VASWCD Legislative Agenda (attached) is basically similar to past years, with requests for additional funding for district operations, dams and cost share. There may be an addition to the agenda to include the issue of solar siting and locality authority.

COMMUNICATION / EDUCATION - Chair Powers

Ms. Atkinson reported she has been busy with schools, especially in Amelia. She has met with several teacher teams at the elementary and middle schools to plan programming. She represented the District at Amelia Academy Dairy Day, where she demonstrated water runoff and BMPs to reduce. The ARKS for Parks backpacks were on display. Mr. Roger Pinholster, who spearheads ARKS for Parks, is also working with the library in Powhatan to loan out the backpacks, which are full of outdoor nature activities. The Envirothon kick-off will be held October 25, 2023. Ms. Atkinson will be assisted Robert E Lee SWCD at Holiday Lake 4H center with activities for Rustburg schools. See staff report for more details on education activities.

DISTRICT MANAGER AND PARTNER AGENCY REPORTS

<u>Staff reports</u> (Attached)

Most items were covered under committee reports. Ms. Fehrer also reported the conservation staff will have their Engineering Job Approval review by Ms. Amanda Pennington, DCR Engineer next week. Mr. Smith is at training this week and will complete several additional training sessions during the next few weeks, after which he will receive his Conservation Planning certification. The DCR Technical Advisory Committee will meet next week and Ms. Fehrer will serve as Mr. Rash's proxy and Mr. Dunn will represent Peter Francisco SWCD. Several VACS projects are in the final phases and will be paid out shortly. Ms. Fehrer reported she completed all the quarterly reports, assisted with two VCAP site visits and other administrative work as reported on the staff report.

Department of Conservation and Recreation (Attached)

Ms. Collins reviewed several highlights on her report including upcoming deadlines and trainings. Districts should be receiving their second quarter disbursements shortly.

Virginia Cooperative Extension

Ms. Gunn reported on several upcoming programs: Small Ruminant Field Day; Youth Livestock Clinic; Women in Ag Cattlewise Program; Private Pesticide Re-certification; and Artificial Insemination Clinic.

USDA-NRCS - Farmville & Amelia (Attached)

Mr. Evans shared his report. His office is processing CSP23 payments and staff have been participating in several outreach events.

Ms. Ciavarella reviewed her report. Her office is working on CSP payments and renewals. NRCS has a new program rollout with details forthcoming. There is currently no funding from Farm Service Agency for new CRP and CREP contracts. Clarimer Hernandez has been hired as the new State Resource Conservationist.

Prince Edward County

Mr. Stanley had several updates: the public comment period for the Sandy River Reservoir permit application has closed; contractors are making repairs to gate valves on the dam. The County is beginning to work on their comprehensive plan and will be soliciting input from the District in regards to agriculture and environmental issues. There has been significant interest in solar installations on properties in the county and a possible data center site on Persimmon Tree road.

Roundtable

Mr. Moyer recognized Bill Powers for his years of service as an elected director on the PSWCD Board. Mr. Powers is not running for re-election. Allison Crews, resigned director from Amelia and Horace Adams, current director from Prince Edward were also recognized for their service.
